Ex-Virginia governor shows how cell phones could help register voters

CONCORD, N.H. Former Virginia Governor Mark Warner showed high school students in New Hampshire today how to use their cell phones to register to vote.

Warner is a possible Democratic presidential candidate and co-founder of the company that became Nextel. He is kicking off a national voter registration drive that uses cell phone technology.

Warner showed students how to use text messages to contact a nonprofit group called Mobile Voter. Mobile Voter that will send out a copy of a state's voter registration form when provided with an e-mail address.

Warner says he's the first political leader to promote the technology to register voters.
